The Prelude

Call to Worship Psalm 46:1-3, 10-11

(If you are with your whole family, the dads can read the part of "pastor" and let the family respond as the congregation. If you are on your own, simply read the words out loud and reflect on their meaning as you speak. The words are used to explain why we worship Him and to entice us to do so.)

Pastor: God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.

Congregation: Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging

Pastor: He says, "Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth.

Congregation: The Lord Almighty is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.

Pastor: Let us Worship God!

Heidelberg Catechism

(Confess together the answer to Question 1)

I am not my own, but belong with body and soul, both in life and in death, to my faithful Savior Jesus Christ.

He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood and has set me free from all the power of the devil.

He also preserves me in such a way that without the will of my heavenly Father not a hair can fall from my head; indeed, all things must work together for my salvation.

Therefore, by his Holy Spirit he also assures me of eternal life and makes me heartily willing and ready from now on to live for him.

(Ask one family member to read the next question out loud. Then all join together to read the answer.)

Question 2 - What do you need to know in order to live and die in the joy of this comfort?

Answer- First, how great my sins and misery are; second, how I am delivered from all my sins and misery; third, how I am to be thankful to God for such deliverance.

New Testament Lesson Philippians 2:1-13

(This passage tells us about Christ's example of humility. His humility secures our salvation and growth in holiness. As a result of the humility and exaltation of Christ, you are called to strive to embrace the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit in your life.)

(Read this passage and quietly confess your sins to the Lord. After the silent time, join together with the prayer of confession listed below.)

Assurance of Pardon Colossians 1:21

"And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him."

If you are trusting in the Lord Jesus Christ as your Savior. If you rest upon him, alone for your salvation. God's word declares that your sins are forgiven in and through Christ. In Jesus, you are adopted to live as a son or daughter of your Heavenly Father. With thankful heart, please sing....
