Call to Worship Isaiah 53: 10-11

(If you are with your whole family, the dads can read the part of "pastor" and let the family respond as the congregation. If you are on your own, simply read the words out loud and reflect on their meaning as you speak.)

From the "suffering servant" passages of Isaiah 52-53, these verses foretold God's resurrection power and his desire to credit his people with the righteousness of his Son.

Pastor: Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him; he has put him to grief, when his soul makes an offering for guilt, he shall see his offspring; he shall prolong his days; the will of the Lord shall prosper in his hand.

Congregation: Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see and be satisfied; by his knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities.

Pastor: Christ is Risen!

Congregation: He is Risen, Indeed!

Pastor: Let us Worship God.

The Invocation Adapted from: *Leading in Prayer- Invocation 34* (You may use the prayer below to ask the Lord's presence as you worship Him.)

O Father, Eternal Lord, God Almighty. In the name of him who is the resurrection and the life, we come to worship you, for Christ is the first born from the dead, the first fruits of those who slept. As his disciples this day, we would proclaim the gospel of his resurrection. This is the day the Lord has made; we rejoice and are glad in it. This is the Lord's Day! All praise be to you. Christ is Risen! To you be glory, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Old Testament Lesson Psalm 22: 1-24

Matthew 27:46 and Mark 15:34 record that when Jesus was on the cross, he quoted Psalm 22. From the cross, Jesus taught that he endured the abandonment of God, so that (in Christ) we are not forsaken by God.

For further study: Psalm 16:10; Isaiah-53:10-11 and Daniel 12:2-3 foretold that the Messiah would be raised from the dead.

These Old Testament passages teach the resurrection for God's people in Christ. Job 19:25-27; Psalm 49:15 and Psalm 73:23-28

Confession of Sin

Consider how the Lord Jesus was forsaken by his Heavenly Father. Remember that your sins were laid upon Christ. By his death your sins were put to death. By his resurrection his righteousness is offered to you. Confess your sins silently. Agree with the Lord, that your particular sins had to be punished, in Christ, on the cross.

Silent Confession

Prayer of Confession

Adapted from The Valley of Vision, p. 170

"God of all life, quicken me to call upon your name, for my mind is ignorant, my thoughts wander, my affections are bound to this earth, my heart unbelieving and only your Spirit can help my infirmities. I approach you as Father and friend, my portion forever, my exceeding joy, my strength of heart. I believe in you as the one and only true God, the ordainer of providence, the sender of Jesus my Savior. My guilty fears discourage an approach to you, but I praise you for the blessed news that Jesus reconciles me to you. Amen."

Assurance of Pardon Romans 5: 1

"Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ."

If you trust in the Lord Jesus Christ as your Savior. If you rest upon him, alone for your salvation, God's word declares that your sins are forgiven in and through Christ. In Jesus, you are adopted to live as a son or daughter of your Heavenly Father. With thankful heart, please sing....
