The Invocation

Old Testament Lesson

Confession of Sin

Consider how the Lord Jesus was forsaken by his Heavenly Father. Remember that your sins were laid upon Christ. By his death your sins were put to death. By his resurrection, his righteousness is offered to you. Confess your sins silently. Agree with the Lord, that your sins were so serious that Christ had to die in your place.

Silent Confession

Prayer of Confession

"Almighty Father, grant me to know that the way of transgressors is hard, that evil paths are wretched paths, that to depart from you is to lose all good. Give me the fullness of a godly grief that trembles and fears, yet ever trusts and loves, which is ever powerful, and ever confident. Grant that through the tears of repentance I may see more clearly the brightness and glories of the saving cross."

Assurance of Pardon

"Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive."

In Christ, your sin has been put to death on the cross and you have been raised with Christ, a new man or woman. If you rest upon him alone for your salvation, God's word declares that your sins are forgiven. In Jesus, you are adopted into the family of your Heavenly Father. With thankful heart, please sing....

The Prelude
