Call to Worship

Psalm 24: 1-5, 7-10

(If you are with your whole family, the dads can read the part of "pastor" and let the family respond as the congregation. If you are on your own, simply read the words out loud and reflect on their meaning as you speak.)

Pastor: The earth is the LORD'S and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein, for he has founded it upon the seas and established it upon the rivers.

Congregation: Who shall ascend the hill of the LORD? And who shall stand in his holy place? He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift up his soul to what is false and does not swear deceitfully. He will receive blessing from the LORD and righteousness from the God of his salvation.

Pastor: Lift up your heads, O gates! And be lifted up, O ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in. Who is this King of glory? The LORD, strong and mighty, the LORD, mighty in battle!

Congregation: Lift up your heads O gates! And lift them up O ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in. Who is this King of glory? The LORD of hosts, he is the King of glory!

Pastor: Let us worship God.

The Invocation

The following is based on Mary's prayer in Luke 1:46-55. Jesus' earthly mother knew the scriptures. Her prayer gleans substance from the Psalms of Praise.

O Lord, we magnify you, we rejoice in you, O God our Savior! You have regarded the low estate of your people in every age. You have done great things for us, and holy is your name! Remember your mercy to us in the name of Christ, for in him we hold fast to the new and eternal covenant. In Jesus the promises to Abraham have been fulfilled. Remember your covenant, once again, as you have from generation to generation. For yours is the Kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen!

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell.* The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church,** the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

*This refers to the realm of the dead, not the place of eternal punishment. **This refers to the universal Church, throughout all time and in all places.

New Testament Lesson

Ephesians 1: 3-14 This particular passage has several phrases that are nearly identical to the Psalm that we will study in our sermon, this morning. You might think of Ephesians 1 as a New Testament way of explaining the wonders found in Psalm 111.

Confession of Sin

Colossians 3: 8-10 (adapted)

Put away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator.

(Do you sin in ways like those listed above? Take a moment and quietly confess any transgression that you have committed before the Lord. Confess your sins silently. Embrace the Lord Jesus by faith as your only hope of salvation.)

Prayer of Confession

"Almighty Father, grant me to know that the way of transgressors is hard, that evil paths are wretched paths, that to depart from you is to lose all good. Give me the fullness of a godly grief that trembles and fears, yet ever trusts and loves, which is ever powerful, and ever confident. Grant that through the tears of repentance I may see more clearly the brightness and glories of the saving cross."

Assurance of Pardon

Galatians 5: 1

"For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery."

God's word declares that your sins are forgiven. Jesus has born your sins and freed you from your bondage.
